From start to finish

As Webster roadways are not equipped to handle shuttle carrier aircrafts, when NASA came to the City of Webster asking for assistance to move its latest acquisition from Ellington Airport to Space Center Houston, Emergency Management Coordinator Joe Ferro knew this would be no easy task, but he was up for the challenge.

During the next two years, Ferro met with businesses and communicated with neighboring entities to coordinate what has been called "the big move."

Finally, on April 28, 2014, after months of planning, the shuttle carrier aircraft trekked seven miles over two nights to Space Center Houston.

On January 22, 2016, Space Center Houston held its pre-opening event. Webster's Mayor, Council Members, and City Manager were able to get a first look at the new exhibit, named Independence Plaza.

The eight-story complex allows visitors to go inside the Shuttle Carrier Aircraft, NASA 905, which is filled with multiple interactive exhibits. Atop the Boeing 747-123 is the shuttle replica where, unlike similar exhibits around the nation, visitors can go inside.


Webster Clean Up Week, March 7-11
