

2016 Election Results

May 7 General and Special Election

A total of 164 Webster residents voted in the 2016 General and Special Election, which had three council positions and eight propositions on the ballot. Edward Lapeyre ran against Bill Jones for Council Position No. 5, and Lapeyre was the victor. Larry Tosto, Position 3, and Beverly Gaines, Position 4,

Lapeyre was the victor. Larry Tosto, Position 3, and Beverly Gaines, Position 4, ran unopposed and were both reelected for another three-year term. At the May 17 council meeting, Tosto and Gaines were reinstalled by City Secretary Crystal Roan. Also at that meeting, Larry Tosto was appointed mayor protem. Edward Lapeyre will be installed at the June 6 council meeting.



Changes that will be implemented include the following:

- · Annual compensation for mayor and council increases via a flat rate.
- Appointment of mayor pro-tem transpires at the first regular council meeting following a regular city election or runoff election, if needed.
- Vacant council positions with a term of 12 months or less are filled by appointment from council.
- Notifications for all public meetings are posted on the City Hall bulletin board and City website, in accordance with state law.
- Runoff elections are held 45 days after the canvassing of returns, in accordance with state law.
- Members of a board or commission have voting rights prior to a period of orientation or instruction.
- Duties and statutory authority of the Building Board of Adjustments and Zoning Board of Adjustments are clearly defined.

The good times will commence at 5 p.m. at Texas Avenue Park on July 4. Guests can try their chances at a prize during a round of Bingo or check out the Webster Police Department's K-9 demonstration. The U.S. Coast Guard will stop by for

a visit as well as a PHI helicopter that will be open for viewing.

Vendors from around the City will be there for guests to enjoy dinner or a sweet treat! Free, refreshing slices of watermelon and tasty snow cones will be handed out, as well!

Plenty of fun can be had by kids during the celebration at Texas Avenue Park. Kids can hang out on the Texas themed playground, cool off from the summer heat at the baseball themed splash pad, or jump around on inflatables.

A Salute to Veterans program will begin around 8 p.m., when U.S. Veterans and servicemen and women will be invited on stage to be acknowledged and awarded commemorative coins. Following the National Anthem, sung by Webster Police Chief Danny Presley, the riveting fireworks show will begin.

Preparing for Hurricane season

Hurricane Preparedness and Public Safety event, June 11

Make sure you have a plan and a kit, says Webster Emergency Management Coordinator Joe Ferro regarding hurricane season. Whether you are preparing for a hurricane or any other hazardous condition, the first step is to have a plan. Know the room you'll need to use in case you are told to shelter in place. Know the additional steps you'll need to take for family members who need assistance, and know how you'll contact family members if the power goes out. The next step is to build a kit that has everything from water and food to financial and personal information.

Residents need to take pictures of their homes in case it is damaged from weather conditions. If the power goes out, residents should have a radio and a flashlight. According to Ferro, residents should tune to

FM 88.7 as their primary source for news.

To get notifications from the City of Webster during emergencies, register for Connect CTY on the City website. Connect CTY will send notifications via phone call, text message, or email and provide updates on severe weather conditions, power outages, and any other important public information.

Residents with healthcare or transportation needs should register for 2-1-1. This free program is a partnership with the City of Webster, State of Texas, and the United Way. By registering annually, Emergency Management will know who

needs help in an emergency and how they need to be assisted.

On June 11, Ferro, along with the fire, police, and public works departments, will be at Academy Sports and Outdoors, 21351 Gulf Freeway, for a Hurricane Preparedness and Public Safety event. They will be handing out information and supplies for a hurricane preparedness kit. Everything from tool kits, to dog bowls, to whistles will be handed out.
