

ORDER DECLARING RESULT OF INCORPORATION ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS)
COUNTY OF HARRIS)
VILLAGE OF WEBSTER)

WHEREAS, on the 8th day of January, 1958, the application of O. O. Pennington and 29 other qualified voters of the proposed Village of Webster, County of Harris, State of Texas, said voters residing within the boundaries of such proposed Village as said boundaries are in such application and hereinafter described by metes and bounds, was duly presented to me, Robert R. Casey, County Judge of Harris County, Texas, and filed in my office, said application praying that an election be ordered held in said proposed Village of Webster, within the boundaries described in said application and hereinafter by metes and bounds, for the purpose of determining whether said proposed Village of Webster, Texas, should incorporate under the Aldermanic Form of Government for municipal purposes, such corporation to include the territory described in said application and to be incorporated by the name of "The Village of Webster", Texas, under and by virtue of the Constitution and general laws of the State of Texas, as a town or village, particularly under the provisions of Chapter 11 of Title 28, Vernon's Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925; and

WHEREAS, on the 10th day of January, 1958, there was, upon evidence heard and proof submitted, found, adjudged and determined by me, the said Robert R. Casey, County Judge: that said proposed Village of Webster, and the territory included within the boundaries thereof as the same are in such application and hereinafter described, was wholly within Harris County, Texas; that the proposed

Village of Webster was not then incorporated for municipal purposes and that no portion thereof was within any municipal corporation; that said application was signed by more than 20 qualified voters who were residents within the boundaries of said proposed Village as described in said application; that the territory embraced within said proposed Village contains less than two square miles; that the said proposed Village contained more than 200 inhabitants residing within the territory in said application described; that all of the land embraced within such boundaries was such as was intended to be used for strictly town purposes; and that the said petitioners were entitled to have the proposition as prayed for in their said application submitted to a vote of the people as described in Chapter 11, Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of 1925. Thereupon, on the 10 day of mJanuary, 1958, I, Robert R. Casey, County Judge of Harris County, ordered that an election be held on the 25th day of January, 1958, in said proposed Village of Webster, Texas, within the boundaries in said application and order described, for the purpose of determining whether the proposed Village of Webster should be incorporated for municipal purposes under the Aldermanic Form of Government pursuant to the provisions of said Chapter 11 of Title 28, which order has been entered in the Minutes of the Commissioners Court of Harris County, Texas, and which is referred to and made a part hereof for all purposes; and

WHEREAS, said election was held on the 25th day of January, 1958, in accordance with said order and in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, on this the 27 day of January, 1958, less than ten (10) days after said election, returns thereof were duly made and filed with me and duly opened and canvassed and it was found and determined that there were

cast at said election 111 votes, of which number:

108 votes were cast for "CORPORATION" and

3 votes were cast for "NO CORPORATION".

The majority for incorporation was therefore 105 votes.

And the said returns of said election being in all respects ~~in~~conformity with law, it was adjudged that a majority of the qualified electors of the said proposed Village of Webster, voting at said election, voted in favor of the said Village of Webster being incorporated for municipal purposes under the Aldermanic Form of Government pursuant to the provisions of said Chapter 11 of Title 28.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Robert R. Casey, County Judge of Harris County, Texas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, particularly by Chapter 11 of Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925, do hereby declare and make known to all persons that the inhabitants of the said Village of Webster, Texas are legally incorporated for municipal purposes under the Aldermanic Form of Government and under the name of "THE VILLAGE OF WEBSTER", said corporation including all of the inhabitants and territory within the boundaries described hereinafter, and said Village of Webster shall henceforth be entitled to exercise all of the rights, powers, immunities, privileges and franchises as conferred by Chapter 11 of Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925, said Chapter relating to towns and villages, and by the Constitution and general laws of the State of Texas, said Village of Webster to include and embrace the following described territory and lands, being the same as described in the aforementioned application and order for election, the same being described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the southwest right of way line of the GH&H Railroad and the southeast right of way line of Wilson Avenue (Seabrook Road);

Thence northeasterly with the southeast right of way line of Seabrook Road 750 feet more or less to its intersection with the southwest right of way line of Old Galveston Road;

Thence southeasterly with the southwest right of way line of Old Galveston Road 3680 feet more or less to its intersection with the southeast right of way line of Henderson Road;

Thence northeasterly along the southeast right of way line of Henderson Road 2590 feet more or less to its intersection with Houston Lighting and Power Company's northeast property line;

Thence southeasterly along Houston Lighting and Power Company's northeast property line 2410 feet more or less to a point for corner;

Thence northeasterly along Houston Lighting and Power Company's property line 475 feet more or less to the northwest bank of Clear Creek;

Thence in the southwest direction up the northwest bank of Clear Creek 12000 feet more or less to its intersection with the northeast right of way line of Texas Avenue;

Thence in a northwesterly direction with the northeast right of way line of Texas Avenue 12,600 feet more or less to its intersection with the southeast right of way line of Jasmine Street;

Thence northeasterly with the southeast right of way line of Jasmine Street 2700 feet more or less to its intersection with the southwest right of way line of the GH&H Railroad;

Thence southeasterly with the southwest right of way line of the said GH&H Railroad 2700 feet more or less to its intersection with the southeast right of way line of Wilson Avenue, the place of beginning.

This order is made and entered by me in the records of the Commissioners Court of Harris County, Texas, on this the 27th day of January, 1958, less than twenty (20) days after the above-described returns were filed with me, and the County Clerk is ordered to prepare and duly certify a true, full and complete copy of this order, together with a plat of said Village of Webster, Texas, and to record same in the proper record of deeds of Harris County, Texas.





NOTICE OF ELECTION

"CORPORATION" OR "NO CORPORATION"

OF VILLAGE OF WEBSTER

STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF HARRIS

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held on the 25th day of January, A. D. 1958 at the Webster Community Church, in Harris County, Texas, in the proposed town of Webster, upon the question of "Corporation" or "No Corporation" of the Village of Webster in accordance with the foregoing order of the County Judge of Harris County, Texas.

ELECTION ORDER

WHEREAS, on the 8th day of January, 1958, a petition dated as of the 8th day of January, 1958, was presented to me and filed in my office by A. D. Pennington, in behalf of himself and 29 other persons whose signatures appeared thereon and who are residents of the village of Webster, Texas, said petition praying that an election be ordered to be held in the territory described in said petition for the purpose of determining whether or not said territory shall be incorporated for municipal purposes as a town or village under the provisions of Chapter 11 of Title 28 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas (1925); and

It appearing that said petition bears the signatures of the requisite number of qualified voters who are residents of said village, and that said petition is in every respect in conformity with law; and

It further appearing that the area comprised within the boundaries defined in said petition does not exceed two (2) square miles, and that all other facts set up in said petition are found to be true;

Therefore I, Robert R. Casey, in my official capacity as County Judge of Harris County, Texas, do hereby grant said petition and do hereby order that an election be held at Webster Community Church in said town or village of Webster, Texas, on the 25th day of January, 1958, for the purpose of determining whether or not the same shall be incorporated for municipal

purposes as a town or village under the provisions of Chapter 11 of Title 28 of the Revised Civil Statutes of Texas (1925); and

I hereby appoint Gessie S. Pennington as the presiding officer at said election, who shall select two judges and two clerks to assist in holding said election.

Every person who has resided within the area proposed to be incorporated for the six months next preceding the date of such election who is a qualified elector under the laws of the State of Texas, shall be entitled to vote at such election.

The ballots to be used in said election shall have written or printed thereon "CORPORATION" and "NO CORPORATION".

Each voter desiring to vote for the incorporation as a town or village shall permit to remain on his or her ballot the word "CORPORATION".

And each voter desiring to vote against the incorporation as a town or village shall permit to remain on his or her ballot the words "NO CORPORATION".

The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the Election Code of the State of Texas except as otherwise provided by the statutes hereinabove referred to.

The territory proposed to be incorporated is fully and accurately described in said petition as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the southwest right of way line of the GHAH Railroad and the southeast right of way line of Wilson Avenue (Seabrook Road);

Thence northeasterly with the southeast right of way line of Seabrook Road 750 feet more or less to its intersection with the southwest

Thence southeasterly with the southwest right of way line of Old Galveston Road 3680 feet more or less to its intersection with the southeast right of way line of Henderson Road;

Thence northeasterly along the southeast right of way line of Henderson Road 2590 feet more or less to its intersection with Houston Lighting and Power Company's northeast property line;

Thence southeasterly along Houston Lighting and Power Company's northeast property line 2410 feet more or less to a point for corner;

Thence northeasterly along Houston Lighting and Power Company's property line 475 feet more or less to the northwest bank of Clear Creek;

Thence in the southwest direction up the northwest bank of Clear Creek 12000 feet more or less to its intersection with the northeast right of way line of Texas Avenue;

Thence in a northwesterly direction with the northeast right of way line of Texas Avenue 12,600 feet more or less to its intersection with the southeast right of way line of Jasmine Street;


Thence northeasterly with the southeast right of way line of Jasmine Street 2700 feet more or less to its intersection with the southwest right of way line of the GH&H Railroad;

Thence southeasterly with the southwest right of way line of the said GH&H Railroad 2700 feet more or less to its intersection with the southeast right of way line of Wilson Avenue, the place of beginning.

The name by which such village is to be known, if it is incorporated, shall be "THE VILLAGE OF WEBSTER."

A copy of this order shall be sufficient notice and advertisement of said election and at least ten (10) days' notice of the time and place of holding said election shall be given by posting three conformed copies of this order at three public places in said village.
