RESOLUTION NO. 11- 11

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER, TEXAS, CANVASSING THE RETURNS OF THE GENERAL ELECTION HELD IN THE CITY OF WEBSTER, TEXAS, ON THE 14th DAY OF MAY 2011, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING A MAYOR AND ONE COUNCILMEMBER; CANVASSING THE RETURNS OF THE SPECIAL ELECTION ON THE SAME DATE FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE CITY CERTAIN PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE EXISTING CHARTER OF THE CITY; DECLARING OFFICERS AND DECLARING EACH AMENDMENT ADOPTED TO THE CITY CHARTER.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Webster, Texas in session, duly called the general election to be held on the 14TH of May 2011, and the election returns of the 120 ballots cast in said election were canvassed for the following officials and measures: Officials for the office of Mayor and Councilmember, Position No 6 and Charter Propositions Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, and 14

WHEREAS, after duly canvassing said returns, the City Council finds that the votes at said election for the candidates for said offices are as follows.

WHEREAS, after duly canvassing said returns, the City Council finds that the votes cast at said election for the Charter propositions are as follows.

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 1 For 101 Against 17

Shall Section 3 01 C, Number, Selection and Term, of Article III be amended to read that "The mayor and each respective councilmember shall be limited to two (2) full consecutive elected terms of office. The mayor, upon completion of a second consecutive full term as mayor, shall not be eligible to be a candidate for councilmember and each respective councilmember, upon completion of a second consecutive full term as councilmember, shall not be eligible to be a candidate for mayor for one full year, effective the first election year after the adoption of this charter amendment?"

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 2 For 110 Against 7
Shall Section 3 02.B, Qualifications, of Article III be amended to read that each councilmember shall have been a resident of Texas and the City of Webster for at least twelve (12) months immediately preceding election day per the State of Texas Election Code and delete, as of the deadline for filing for the office?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 3 For 107 Against 10
Shall Section 3 02.E, Qualifications, of Article III be amended to add a candidate is barred from running for office if the candidate has been convicted of an offense involving moral turpitude?

CHARTER PROPOSITIN NO 4 For 83 Against 33
Shall Section 3 09.B, Procedure, of Article III, be amended to agree with Sections 3 07.B and E that the mayor or a consensus of three councilmembers instead of any member of council may offer any ordinance in writing that they desire and have it placed on the agenda of a regular council meeting?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 5 For 106 Against 11
Shall Section 3 09.D, Reading, of Article III, be amended to clarify that printed copies of proposed ordinances are in front of all members of the council that are present at the meeting?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 6 For 91 Against 20
Shall Section 3 11.B, Codification, of Article III, be amended that supplements to the Code of Ordinances shall be prepared and printed by contract or by city personnel whenever authorized or directed by the city and delete every five (5) years?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 7 For 101 Against 14
Shall Section 7 03.A, Circulation and Form of Petition, of Article VII be amended to read that all petition blanks be approved by the city attorney within two (2) business days instead of the next business day?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 8. For 101 Against 12
Shall Section 7 03.A, Circulation and Form of Petition, of Article VII be amended to add that all petitions shall be filed in accordance with this charter and state law?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 9 For 82 Against 31
Shall Section 8.08 C, Annual Audit, of Article VIII, be amended to allow publication of notice of the annual audit on the city's website instead of the official newspaper?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 10 For 81 Against 29
Shall Section 9 01 C, Authority, Composition, and Procedures, of Article IX be amended to clarify that councilmembers may serve on a board, commission, or

committee of the city, such as a Tax Increment Reinvestment Zone Board or a statutory economic development board, as expressly permitted by law?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 11 For 66 Against 49
Shall Section 9 02.C, Plats, of Article IX be amended to grant exclusive plat approval to the Planning and Zoning Commission instead of the city council?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 12. For 95 Against 18
Shall Section 9 02.C, Plats, of Article IX be amended to delete all references to Article 974a of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925 and add, in compliance with State law?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 13 For 97 Against 16
Shall Section 9 03, Boards of Adjustments, of Article IX, be amended to clarify that the duties of the Electrical Board are now under the Building Board of Adjustment by deleting the term electrical board?

CHARTER PROPOSITION NO 14 For 83 Against 29
Shall Section 12.13, Charter Review Commission, of Article XII, be amended to appoint seven (7) instead of nine (9) members to the commission?

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WEBSTER, TEXAS

Section 1 That the results of said regular City election be and the same are hereby declared to have been as herein set out, and the following named persons were elected to the respective positions subject to the taking of their oaths of office as provided by the laws of the State of Texas and Charter of the City of Webster, Texas.



Section 2. That the results of said Special City Election be and the same are hereby declared to have been as herein set out, and Charter proposition Nos. 1 through 14 passed. Said propositions shall become part of the Charter of the City of Webster, Texas, and it is hereby declared that each amendment to the Charter as fully set out in the Resolution calling said Charter amendments election is hereby adopted.

Section 3 The City Council of the City of Webster further finds that notice of said election was duly and properly given as required by law, and that said election was duly held and returns thereof were duly made by the proper officials of said election and in all things according to law
