

ORDER DECLARING RESULTS OF ELECTION FOR A
MAYOR, A MARSHAL AND FIVE ALDERMEN

WHEREAS, on the ~~25~~^{21st} day of January, 1958, an order was entered in the records of the Commissioners Court of Harris County declaring the inhabitants of the Village of Webster, Texas, as such Village is in said entry described, incorporated within the boundaries thereof under the Aldermanic Form of Government pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 11, Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925, and

WHEREAS, on the 29 day of January, 1958, an order was entered in the same records calling an election to be held on the 15th day of February, 1958 for the purpose of electing a Mayor, a Marshal and five Aldermen for said Village of Webster, and

WHEREAS, said election was held on the 15th day of February, 1958, in accordance with said order and in accordance with the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, after due notice had been given as required by law; and

WHEREAS, on this the 20th day of February, 1958, the returns of said election having been duly made and filed with me and having been duly opened and canvassed by me, in the manner required by law, it was found and determined that there were cast at said election the following votes:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Robert R. Casey, County Judge of Harris County, Texas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 11, Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925, hereby declare and make known to all persons that Artis Davis was thereby elected Mayor of the Village of Webster by a vote of the greatest number of the qualified electors;

That Carl J. Hollingsworth was thereby elected Marshal of the Village of Webster by a vote of the greatest number of the qualified electors;

That A. R. Johnson, John W. Hardy, Marshall N. Denman, Raymond J. Guiberteau and Roy J. Galatian were thereby elected Aldermen of the Village of Webster by a vote of the greatest number of the qualified electors; and

That the officers immediately above named, after they have qualified as required by law, shall be the duly qualified and acting Mayor, Marshal and Aldermen of the Village of Webster, Texas.

Instructions for Tally of Absentee Ballots

1. One of the Judges of election, in the presence of the election officers shall, between the hours of 2 p.m. and 3 p.m., open the carrier envelopes.
2. Announce each and every one of the elector's names and compare the signature upon the applications with the affidavits upon the ballot envelopes.
3. In the presence of watchers, if any, open the ballot envelopes and take out the ballot without permitting same to be unfolded or examined.
4. Presiding officer shall endorse ballots, enter name of elector in poll list, number same and deposit in "Absentee Ballot Box."
5. After all such absentee ballots have been deposited in such absentee ballot box, the officers of such election shall designate such of their number as will not interfere with uninterrupted use of voting machines as provided for in Section 107 of this Act.
6. Absentee voting and the count of absentee ballots is conducted as outlined under sub sec. 7 of Section 79 and Section 107 Texas Election Laws.

ELECTION ORDER

THE STATE OF TEXAS }
COUNTY OF HARRIS }

BE IT REMEMBERED, that on the 27th day of January, 1958, in conformity with Chapter 11, Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended, the undersigned County Judge of Harris County, Texas, made and entered in the Minutes of the Commissioners' Court of Harris County, Texas, an Order declaring that the inhabitants of the Village of Webster, Texas, are incorporated within the boundaries thereof and designated the boundaries thereof in such entry; and

It affirmatively appearing that a certified copy of such Order, together with a plat of the said Village of Webster, Texas, has been filed for record in the Deed Records of Harris County, Texas;

THEREFORE, I, Bob Casey, County Judge of Harris County, Texas, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Chapter 11, Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended, and in compliance therewith, do hereby ORDER that:

I

An election be held on the 15th day of February 1958, at WEBSTER COMMUNITY CHURCH

_____ in the said incorporated Village of Webster, Texas, for the purpose of electing a Mayor, a Marshal and five (5) Aldermen, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 11, Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended.

II

Any person desiring his name to appear upon the official ballot at such election may do so by presenting his application to the undersigned Bob Casey, County Judge of Harris

County, Texas, before midnight, 12:00 o'clock P.M., of the 12 day of February 1958, and such application shall set forth:

- (1) The name of the office sought;
- (2) The applicant's name, post office address and the County of his residence;
- (3) The applicant's age, place of birth, kind of citizenship and length of residence in the limits of the Village of Webster, County of Harris, State of Texas.
- (4) Such application must also be accompanied by an affidavit in substantially the following form:

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared _____ who, after being first duly sworn, on his oath deposed and said:

If I am elected to the office of _____ of the Village of Webster, Texas, I will support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States and of this State of Texas, and further that I believe in, approve of, and if elected to such office I will support and defend our present representative form of government and will resist any effort or movement from any source which seeks to subvert or destroy the same or any part thereof.

I further certify and affirm that I am not a candidate or nominee of any political party whose principles include any thought or purpose of setting aside the representative form of government and substituting therefor any other form of government and I am not a candidate or nominee of the Communist Party, of the Fascist Party or the Nazi Party.

The following person is hereby appointed to conduct said election:

Mrs O. O. PENNINGTON
Presiding Judge

who shall select two judges and two clerks to assist in holding it.

IV

Ten (10) days' notice of said election shall be given by posting a notice containing a copy of this Order at three (3) public places in the incorporated Village of Webster, Texas, all of which such places shall be within the boundaries of said village. Such notice shall be posted at least ten (10) days prior to the date of holding said election and said election shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution and the Laws of the State of Texas.

V

Only those persons who have attained the age of twenty-one (21) years and who have resided within the limits of the Village of Webster, Texas, for six (6) months next preceding said election and who are qualified electors under the laws of the State of Texas shall be entitled to vote at the election.

VI

The ballots of said election shall conform to the requirements of Chapter 6 of the Election Code of the State of Texas, Chapter 492, Acts of the 52d Legislature, so far as applicable.

VII

The presiding Judge of said election shall make return thereof to the undersigned County Judge of Harris County, Texas within ten (10) days after the holding thereof.

VIII

The sheriff of Harris County, Texas is directed to post a notice of said election at three (3) widely separate public places within the boundaries of the Village

of Webster, Texas, at least ten (10) days prior to the 15th
day of February 1958.
