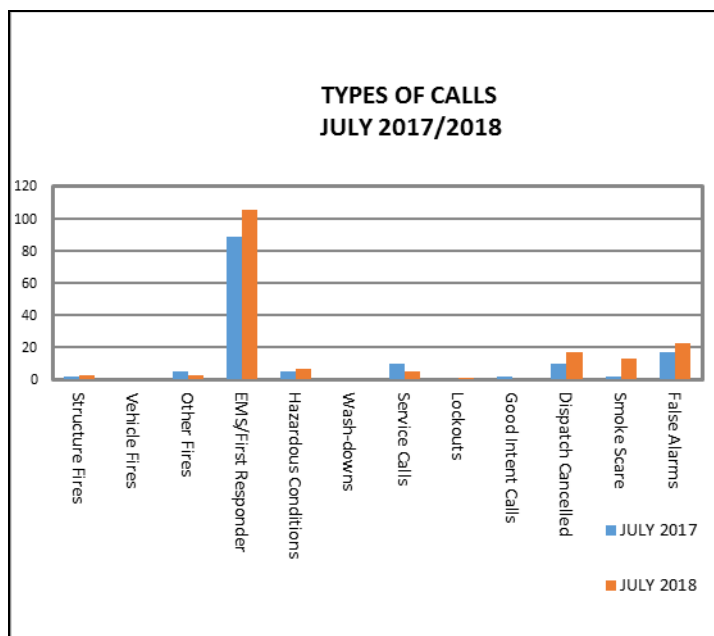

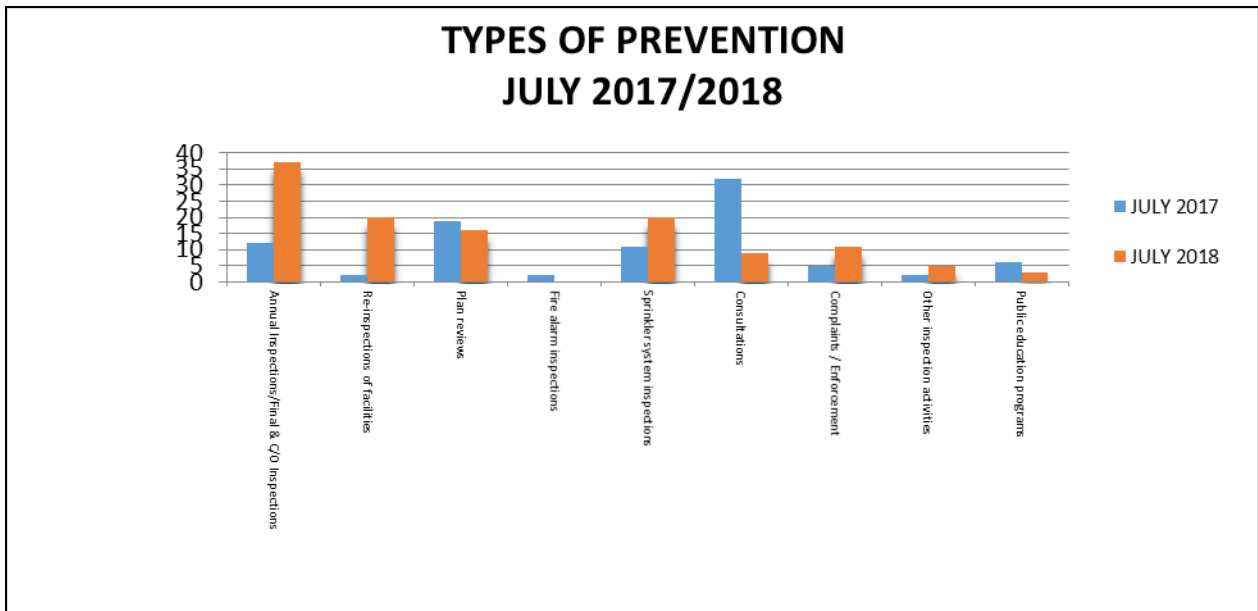


## FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

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## WFD – Special Operations Report - July 2018

### **Dive Team: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell**

#### Dive Response:

1. Webster Special Operations Unit received no requests for response during July 2018.

#### Dive Training:

1. July 26, 2018: D. Spencer completed PADI Public Safety Diver certification on Thursday, July 26, 2018, accompanied by W. Chappell assisting and training on underwater search and recovery techniques.
2. New equipment tested during the above training event performed flawlessly.
3. Upcoming training:
  - Still coordinating instruction for PADI Tender certification training for current roster and other FD/PD members interested in performing that particular function.
  - Search patterns, equipment set up and inspection including SOG review scheduled for Friday, August 3, 2018, from 08:00 to 11:00 hrs. for all divers and future tenders. This will be in-house, dry training held at Station 1.

### **Rescue Boat: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell**

#### Rescue Boat Response:

1. One nonemergency, mutual-aid call on Tuesday, July 31, 2018, with League City to retrieve a stranded personal watercraft with two (2) persons on board at Clear Creek under Highway 3. Successful retrieval of persons and watercraft without incident by D. Spencer and W. Chappell.

#### Rescue Boat Training:

1. July 18, 2018: D. Spencer, W. Chappell, and K. Dozier launched Rescue Boat-14 for some instrumentation tests of new equipment associated with sonar. It was discovered that the new equipment was not compatible and did not work properly. A resolution to update software or exchange hardware that is compatible is underway. Remainder of training time spent instructing K. Dozier concerning boat controls, approaching and recovering a victim in the water, and trailering the boat.



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Meeting:

1. No formal meetings were conducted during July 2018, only onsite briefings and debriefings.

**Car Seats: Report submitted by S. Ricicar**

1. The WFD CPS technicians assisted with six (6) car-seat installations during July 2018. Car-seat installations are handled as needed at the fire station, and through participation at special events held at the fire station and outside venues.

**Wildland: Report submitted by Shift Commander J. Myers**

Training: Five (5) members completed a S131 Class (FF1).

Deployment: One deployment to Killen, Texas, with two (2) firefighters and Chief Shipp deployed with the Type-6 engine and a Strike Team vehicle.
