




FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

WFD – SPECIAL OPS – APRIL 2016 – MONTHLY REPORT

*****<u>ASSISTANCE TO FLOOD VICTIMS IN HARRIS COUNTY, TEXAS</u>*****

In response to the historic rainfall that pounded the City of Houston and the outlying Harris County area in April 2016, the City of Webster Fire Department dispatched two (2) teams of firefighters to assist. The first team set out in the midst of the record-setting rain in WFD's Rescue-15 to assist the Houston Fire Department, and the second team set out the next day to assist the Cypress Creek Fire Department.

- 1. Monday, April 18, 2016, SC Les Thomas and FF Robert Montalbano assisted HFD in response to flood victims centralized in the Greenspoint District. Their duties included search and rescue, and responding to 9-1-1 calls in the queue.
- 2. Tuesday, April 19, 2016, AFM Warren Chappell and FF Jason Myers assisted the Cypress Creek Fire Department in their response to neighborhood flood victims. WFD utilized Utility-1 and launched Rescue Boat-15. WFD's team concentrated their efforts in the vicinity of Huffmeister Road and Maxwell Road. This area runs parallel to Cypress Creek. Their duties included search and rescue, and responding to 9-1-1 calls in the queue. They transported five (5) adults and three (3) children evacuating to safe ground.
