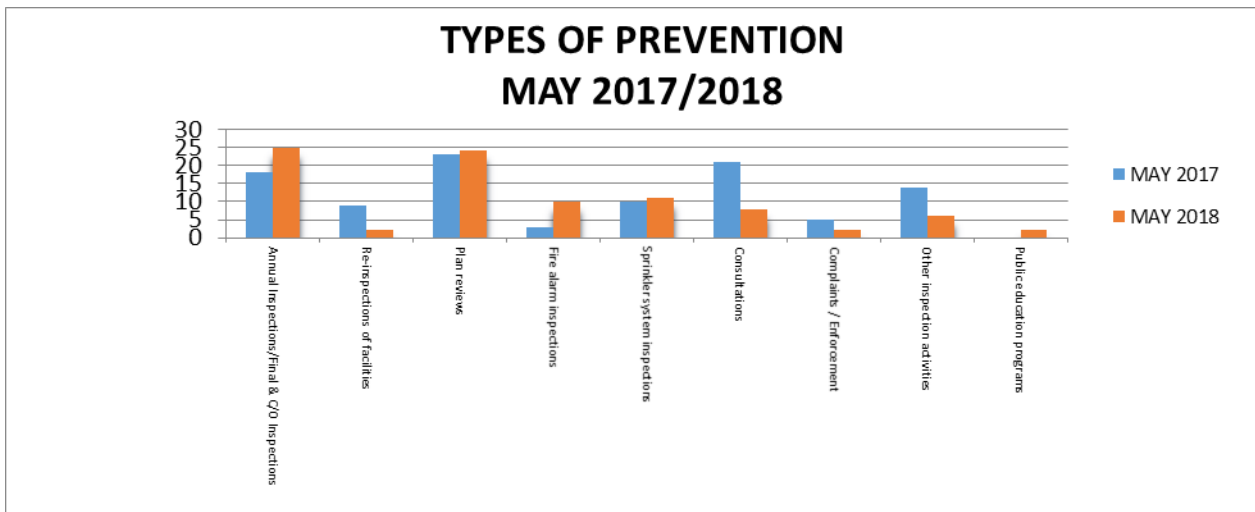


## FIRE PREVENTION DEPARTMENT UPDATE

## WFD – Special Operations Report - May 2018

### **Dive Team: Report submitted by Assistant Fire Marshal W. Chappell**

#### Dive Response:

1. Webster Special Operations Unit received no requests for response during May 2018.

#### Training:

1. Webster Special Operations Unit conducted the following training during May 2018:
  - dry-suit and full-mask training; and
  - boat operations.

#### Meeting:

1. The Webster Special Operations Unit members met and discussed:
  - future training exercises.

### **Car Seats:**

1. The WFD CPS technicians assisted with six (6) car-seat installations during May 2018. Car-seat installations are handled as needed at the fire station, and through participation at special events held at the fire station and outside venues.

### **Wildland: Report submitted by Lt. J. Myers**

Training: On April 23, 2018, WFD conducted a S130 Field Day course with three (3) FFs in attendance. This was the final class required to make them response-ready. Currently, WFD is planning a S131 class to be held within the next thirty (30) days.

#### Deployments:

- On May 2, 2018, WFD was deployed to battle the McDannald Fire in Fort Davis, Texas.
- On May 3, 2018, at 02:00, the team departed Webster for the assignment. Chief Shipp and Lt. Myers responded as Strike Team Leaders over teams consisting of ten (10) engines and twenty-five (25) personnel. This event was managed by TFS and the Type 1 Southern Area RED Team.

- On May 10, 2018, Lt. Myers and Strike Team 127 departed the McDannald Fire to respond to the Mallard Fire outside of Amarillo. Strike Team 127 remained at this complex until demobilized May 15, 2018 to return home. This event was also managed by TFS and the Type 1 Southern Area Red Team.
  - On May 11, 2018, Chief Shipp and Strike Team 123 were demobilized from the McDannald Fire, and returned to Webster.
  - On May 10, 2018, Brush-14 was demobilized for mechanical issues en route to the Mallard Fire. Currently, the truck is in Amarillo awaiting repairs.
  - Booster-14 returned to Webster, and it was sent to the Ford dealership for mechanical issues. The dealership replaced its turbo under warranty, and it is back at WFD.
